



Declaration of Permitted Resources

The following tools do not have to be acknowledged as resources and may be used for seminar papers and final projects (even if they are AI-based):

- Word processing programmes (e.g. Word or OpenOffice Writer)
- Spreadsheets (e.g. Excel or LibreOffice Calc)
- Spelling and grammar checks, including tools in word processing programmes (e.g. DeepKomma)
- Search engines
- Online dictionaries and thesauri
- Mind map tools
- Research tools (e.g. literature search using PubMed)
- Research tools that do not generate ideas (e.g. literature search using Google Scholar)
- *Additional resources...*

Seminar papers and final projects should predominantly reflect the thoughts, ideas and insights of their author. Any passages generated by AI must be clearly identified as such. Below you will find a list of AI tools permitted for this particular project or paper and information on how their use should be acknowledged. Please include a separate appendix in which you acknowledge your use of AI.

Permitted tools:

- Text generating** AI tools: AI-generated text may be copied directly or indirectly (including source codes, mathematical expressions etc).
- Image generating** AI tools: AI-generated images may be copied directly.
- Image editing** AI tools: AI-edited images may be copied directly.
- Translations** generated by AI tools: AI-generated translations may be copied directly.
- Additional tools...*

The acknowledgement in your appendix should at least include the type and version of the AI tool you used. In addition, you must include the following information:

- Content directly generated by AI.
- The time and date you used AI.
- A complete reference of the input you used to generate results (e.g. your prompts)
- A complete reference of the output generated by AI.
- If available: The URL used to access the tool.
- Additional requirements...*

If you rework content produced by AI in a sequence of multiple steps, each step must be documented separately. You can document this process (as well as all inputs and outputs) by including links to uneditable chat logs.
